Registration for Camp Onas 2020 is now open!!!

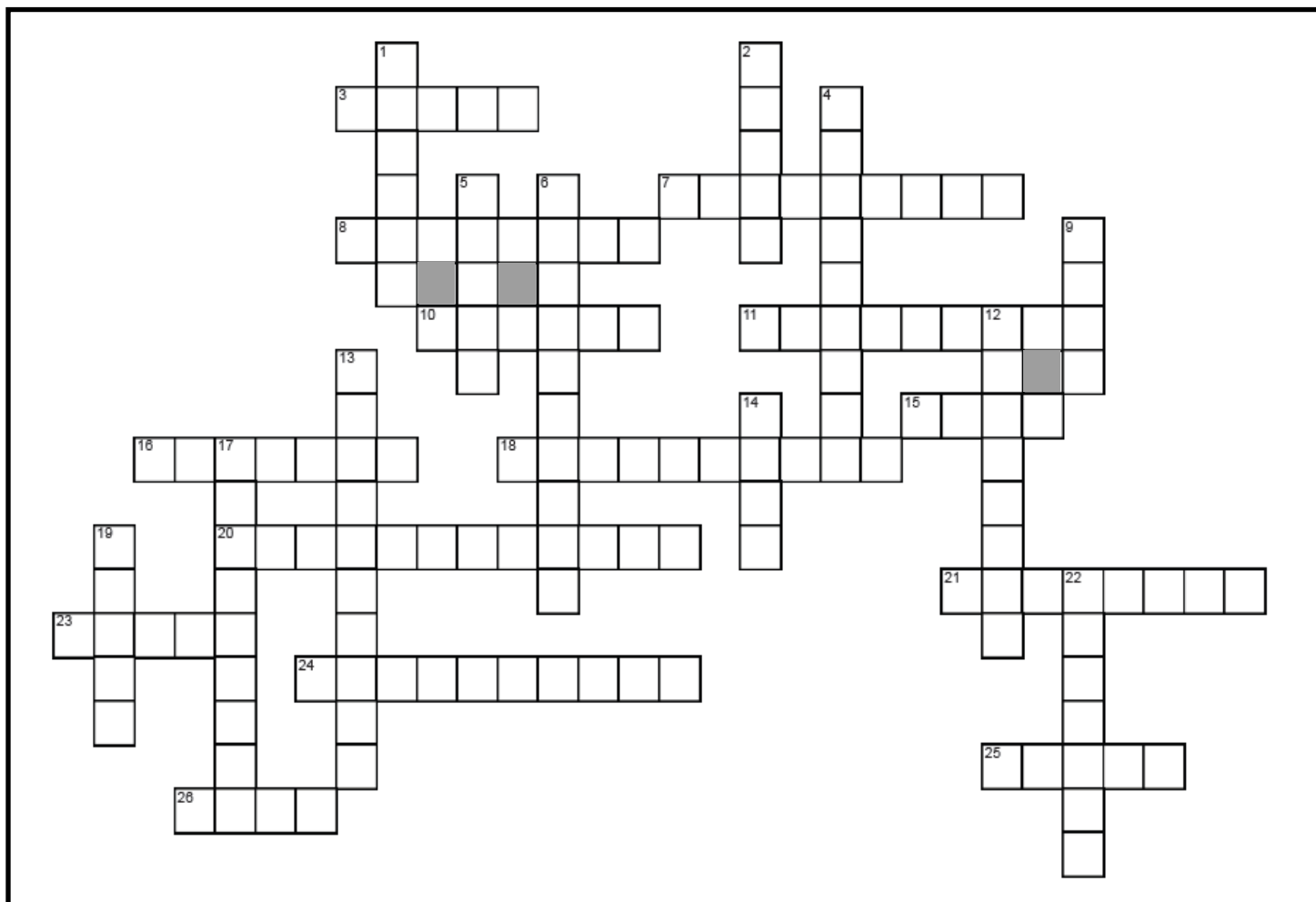
